**Q:** Life can be very **tough** at times, and **Satan** is always trying to **trip us up**. In what **four ways** does God provide help for us today?

- 1. His Word—the instruction manual for peak performance
  - a. We have **hope** through the **encouragement** of the Scripture (Rom 15:4)
  - b. Offensive **weapon**: "Sword of the Spirit" (Eph 6:17)
  - c. A **measuring device** ("living," "active," "sharp," "able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart" (Heb 4:12)
- 2. His **Spirit**—the **Comforter** or **Helper** (ASV)
  - a. John 14:16-17, 14:26, 15:26, 16:7
- 3. The **Church**—"...encourage one another, and build up one another..." (1 Thes 5:11)
- 4. **Angels—ministering spirits** (and much **more**!)

- 2. Renaissance Artwork often featured angels
  - a. Human-like in appearance
  - b. Wings
  - c. Halo
  - d. Often pictured in the air (above man, beneath God)

**A:** Scripture!

- 3. But what does the **Bible** say about angels?
  - a. Are there still angels **today**?
  - b. Where do they come **from**?
  - c. What are their **characteristics**?
  - d. What do they **do**?

- 5. Which angel appeared to Mary and to Zacharias? (Gabriel (Luke 1:5-38))

- 7. What Roman official was visited by an angel who told him God had heard his prayers? (Cornelius (Acts 10:1-8))

### Are they're still angels today?

- 1. The word "angel" appears 292 times in the Bible
  - a. 114 times in the Old Testament
  - b. 178 times in the New Testament (77 times in Revelation!)
  - c. Only **two** angels referred to by **name** 
    - i. Michael and Gabriel ("Hero of God")
- 2. Spoken of in the past, present, and future sense
- 3. If you believe the **Bible**, then you believe in **angels**!

## Where do angels come from?

- 1. They are **created beings** 
  - a. < Read Col 1:16> Like everything else, they were created by Jesus for Jesus
    - i. Jesus was the agent of creation
    - ii. "rule and authority and power and dominion"—Rabbinic references to angels
  - b. Psalms 148:1-5 lists angels as part of **God's eternal creation**
  - c. Bible doesn't say **when** they were created, but Job 38:4-7 indicates that "the Sons of God" (common biblical name for angels) were **present** and **rejoiced** at earth's **creation**
- 2. They are **between** man and God in the **hierarchy** of creation
  - a. Angels beneath Jesus < Read Heb 1:1-4>
  - b. Man beneath angels < **Read Heb 2:6-7**> (2 Pet 2:10-11)
  - c. NB: 1 Cor 6:3 says the saints will judge the angels

## Characteristics of angels

- 1. They are spirits < Read Heb 1:13-14>
- 2. They are **distinct** from **human beings** (1 Cor 6:3, Heb 1:14)
- 3. They can **choose** between **right** and **wrong** 
  - a. <Read 2 Pet 2:4> <Read Jude 6> Had a special place, but some sinned and "abandoned their proper abode" and were cast into hell until judgment
- 4. Jesus taught that angels do not marry
  - a. Sadducees test Jesus by discussing marriage in heaven (Mark 12:25)

- 5. As a group, they're very organized
  - a. Various **types** of angels
  - b. One **Archangel**—Michael (Jude 9)
  - c. **Ruling** angels (Eph 3:10—more "rulers and authorities" language)
  - d. Guardian angels
    - i. For all **believers** < **Read Heb 1:14**> (see also Ps 91:11-12)
    - ii. For children < Read Matt 18:10>
  - e. **Seraphim** (Isaiah 6:1-3)
    - i. Have six wings
    - ii. Involved in worshipping God
  - f. **Cherubim** (see Ezekiel Chap 1 and Chap 10)
    - i. Have human form, with four faces, four wings, and hands like man's.
    - ii. Involved in guarding the holiness of God.
    - iii. **Satan** is an angel of order Cherubim, and was the highest of angels until his fall (Ezek 28:12-19; Is 14:12, 14:14).
- 6. They're **not to be worshipped** (Judges 13:15-16 (Manoah), Col 2:18)
- 7. They have **intellect** but they're not "**all-knowing**"
  - a. 1 Pet 1:12 says they didn't understand prophecies concerning salvation through Christ
  - b. They **long** for **truth** just like we do
- 8. They have **emotion** (Luke 2:7-14)(joy; praise for God; a sense of *our* emotion (empathy))
- 9. They have **superhuman strength**, but they aren't "**all powerful**"
  - a. Psalms 103:20 ("mighty in strength")
  - b. 2 Pet 2:11 ("greater in might and power" than man, but they show restraint)
  - c. 2 Thes 1:7-8 (the Lord will return "with his mighty angels in flaming fire")
  - d. Dan 6:22 (angels shut the lions' mouths)
  - e. Acts 5:19 (opened prison gates for the apostles)
- 10. They are **innumerable** (Heb 12:22, Deut 33:2, Ps 68:17, Matt 26:53 (72,000), Mark 5:9, Luke 2:13, Rev 5:11("myriads of myriads")
- 11. They don't **procreate** (their number was **fixed** at **creation**)

## What do angels do?

- 1. Act as **special messengers** for God
  - a. Warned Abraham and Lot of the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah (Gen 19)
  - b. **Prevented** the **sacrifice** of Isaac
    - i. "But the angel of the Lord called from heaven and said 'Abraham, Abraham, do not stretch out your hand against the lad'" (Gen 22:12)
  - c. Announced the birth of Samson to Manoah and his wife (Judges 13:3)
  - d. Gabriel ("Hero of God") **explained** Daniel's vision to him (Dan 9:23)
- 2. Very active in the life of **Christ** 
  - a. Gabriel **foretold birth** of **John** the Baptist (Luke 1:19) and **Jesus** (Matt 1:20-21, Luke 1:26-38)
  - b. An angel **instructed Joseph** concerning **naming** and **protecting** the baby **Jesus** (Matt 1:20-21, 2:13,19-20).
  - c. Angels watched Jesus while on earth (1 Tim 3:16).
  - d. **Strengthened** Him after temptation (Matt 4:11).
  - e. Would have **defended** Him (12 legions) (Matt 26:53).
  - f. **Strengthened** Him in Gethsemane (Luke 22:43).
  - g. Rolled away the **stone** from tomb (Matt 28:2).
  - h. Announced the **resurrection** (Mat 28:6).

- i. Two angels announced and accompanied Jesus in His ascension (Acts 1:10)
- j. Two angels announced the **manner** of His **return** (Acts 1:11).
- k. Will return with Him (2 Thes 1:7-8).
- 3. Active in the lives of **believers** 
  - a. As I said, they're "ministering spirits" to believers (Heb 1:14) and children (Matt 18:10), "... guarding us in all our ways" < Read Ps 91:11-12>
  - b. Observe Christian's **experiences** (1 Cor 4:9, 1 Tim 5:21).
  - c. Interested in evangelistic efforts of Christians < Read Luke 15:10>
    - i. Guided Philip to the Eunuch on Gaza road (Acts 8:26-29).
  - d. Involved in answering prayer < Read Acts 12:5-8>
  - e. **Encourage** us in times of **danger** (Acts 27:23-24).
  - f. Care for righteous at death
    - i. Lazarus carried to "Abraham's bosom" by angels (Luke 16:22)
- 4. Active in the lives of **unbelievers** 
  - a. Announce impending **judgment** < **Read Rev 14:6-11**> (Gen 19:13) (Sodom)
    - i. And they struck the wicked men of Sodom **blind** (Gen 19)
  - b. Inflict punishment
    - i. Smote **Herod** when he allowed himself to be called a god (Acts 12:23) ("the voice of a god and not of a man!" he didn't give God the glory)
  - c. Will be the "harvesters" who separate the "weeds" (everything that causes sin and all who do evil) from the "wheat" (the righteous) during the "harvest" (end of the age) (Jesus' explanation of the parable of the soils in Matt 13:37-43)

### Closing remarks

- 1. Angels are very much a part of God's plan
  - a. They're used as **messengers**
  - b. They watch and help believers
  - c. They're going to play a big part in the events of the **end** of the **age**
  - d. They'll be judged by Christians (1 Cor 6:3)
- 2. We're told to love the brethren and to "show hospitality to strangers" because "some have entertained angels without knowing it." < Read Heb 13:1-2>.
